Minutes

Moved by Mr. Gebert, seconded by Wyatt and carried, that minutes of last meeting as previously circulated to members, be approved.

Auditing Committee

Chairman McCollum appointed Messrs. Johnson and Wyatt as the Auditing Committee.

Employee Group Insurance Secretary had written to Mr. James Cunningham, as directed (copy appended). It was expected that Mr. Cunningham would have a report for the November meeting of the Board.

Staff Changes Doctor Knipe introduced Mr. Charles H. Mangum, Sanitarian, who had been appointed October 1.

Doctor Knipe wished authorization to waive the Personnel Policies requirement in the case of Miss Grace Timmer, Public Health Nurse, whereby she would normally be retired in December, 1960. Moved by Mr. Gebert, seconded by Mr. Kraetz, and carried, that paragraph (17), Section XVII, of the Health District Merit System and Personnel Policies be waived in the case of Miss Grace Timmer for a period of one year, or to December, 1961.

It was agreed that requests for extension of the sixty-five year age retirement requirement be granted in future for not more than a one year period.

Next Meeting Due to Election Day felling on November 8 (the second Tuesday of the month) it was agreed that the next meeting of the Board be advanced to Monday, November 7, at 2 p.m.

Sanitation Complaint Mr. Johnson raised the matter of dumping of fish offal and other waste at and near the 14th Street Dock allegedly by the Everett Fish Company. Mr. Stockton was asked to look into this and have the nuisance abated.

Reports

Health Officer: Doctor Knipe gave a brief report on the Washington State Public Health Association Annual Meeting in Spokane, which had been attended by several staff members.

Sanitation: Mr. Stockton presented a narrative and statistical report, as attached. Mr. Johnson commended Mr. Stockton on the activity of the Sanitation Division, and stated that he personally was quite satisfied with the activities of the Department.

Financial: As appended.

Mr. McCollum raised the question as to whether or not penalty for dumping refuse on roadsides should not be increased. It was pointed out by Mr. Stockton that the maximum penalty was now \$300. This was considered sufficient by the members.
