MINUTES SNOHOMISH DISTRICT BOARD OF HEALTH August 14, 1962

Present

Members, Mrs. Simpson, Messrs. McCollum, Stocker, Johnson, Wyatt, Gebert. Also Miss Findlay, Dr. Darrough, Dr. Beare, Mr. Ingram, Mr. Stockton, Mrs. Schultz, and Mrs. Supper.

Minutes

Moved by Mrs. Simpson, seconded by Mr. Wyatt, and carried that the minutes of the July meeting and as previously circulated to members, be approved.

Auditing Committee Chairman McCollum appointed Mrs. Simpson and Mr. Wyatt as the Auditing Committee.

Unfinished Business Dr. McLaughlin of Regina, Canada, has made application for the position of District Health Officer. Arrangements have been made by Dr. Wallace Lane, State Health Department, for Dr. McLaughlin to meet with the Board of Health on August 22 at 10:30 a.m. It was agreed by members of the Board that this meeting be held in the City Commissioners' Office. Dr. Beare was requested to make available copies of Dr. McLaughlin's credentials for perusal by Board members. Luncheon arrangements will be made by Dr. Beare for the Board members and Drs. Lane, McLaughlin, and Beare.

New Business Moved by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Dr. Stocker, and carried that the attached resolution providing for transfer of monies from the "SALARIES" portion of the 1962 budget to "MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION - FEES" to pay for fees for services presented by Dr. Darrough and Firland Sanatorium, be adopted.

Moved by Dr. Stocker, seconded by Mr. Gebert, and carried that the attached resolution providing for the transfer of monies from CAPITAL OUTLAY - USED FURNITURE TO CAPITAL OUTLAY - FIELD TEST KIT, be adopted.

Moved by Mr. Gebert, seconded by Mr. Wyatt, and carried that Dr. Beare's salary be increased from \$800 to \$875 for the month of August as per letter attached from the State Health Department signed by Dr. Wallace Lane.

Staff Changes Moved by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Dr. Stocker and carried, that the following resignations be accepted: James Smith, General Sanitarian, effective August 31; Jeanne Brodsack, PHN II, effective August 31; Gladys Ittner, PHN II, effective August 24; Dr. John Beare, Resident Trainee, effective August 31.

Dr. Stocker expressed appreciation to Dr. Beare for the fine work he has done during the past months. Mr. McCollum and other members of the Board joined in a vote of thanks. It was moved by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Dr. Stocker, and carried that a letter of commendation be written and signed by the Board and presented to Dr. Beare.

Moved by Mr. Gebert, seconded by Mr. Wyatt, and carried that the

following appointments be accepted: Bill Franklin, Sr. General Sanitarian, September 1, at a monthly salary of \$492; Helen Scales, PHN III, August 20, at a monthly salary of \$414; Hope Smith, PHN II, August 6, at a monthly salary of \$397; Ada Frisk, PHN II, September 4, at a monthly salary of \$397; Joseph Thomas, Social Work Consultant, August 20, at a monthly salary of \$471.

Moved by Mr. Gebert, seconded by Mr. Wyatt, and carried that Mr. Ingram, Mr. Johnson, Mr. Stockton, and Miss Findlay act as a committee to formulate a policy regarding the re-hiring of former employees for inclusion into the employee Merit System and bring such as a recommendation to the Board of Health for its consideration.

X-Ray Equipment

In order that the Snohomish Health District may procure adequately functioning X-ray equipment, Dr. Beare presented the attached letter from the State Health Department, authorizing the transfer of \$9,000 from Item 5 of the 1962 Tuberculosis Control Budget to Item I of that budget. Mr. Ingram explained that Item I contains money which is transferred monthly to the Snohomish Health District Pooling Fund and thus under the jurisdiction of the Board of Health Dr. Beare presented in detail quotations for replacement of present equipment and for conversion of same from three companies. After a discussion, the Board instructed Dr. Darrough and Dr. Beare to meet with Dr. Richard C. Kiltz, Everett radiologist, discuss the present equipment with him, and ask him to submit a letter giving his opinion as to the need for change of the present X-ray equipment and his feeling as to replacement versus conversion of the system. The Board voted to recess this meeting until Friday, August 17, at 1:30 p.m., at which time further consideration of the problem would be made pending the receipt of Dr. Kiltz's findings.

Preliminary Budget

The Snohomish Health District preliminary budget for 1963 was presented to the Board and explained item by item by Dr. Beare. To serve as a justification for one of the budgetary entries, a report of the Health District owned automobiles was presented with the recommendation that the Health District begin the replacement of at least one or two automobiles per year on a cash basis.

Reports

Dr. Beare reported as follows:

- 1. Two candidates for the vacancy of Community Mental Health Consultant will be interviewed on August 15.
- 2. As the social worker will begin his employment on August 20, lack of a room in the Health District building for him will necessitate the partitioning of the present conference room. This month's Board of Health meeting was held in the County Agricultural building in anticipation for future use by the Board should it approve the partitioning of the present conference room in the Health District office building. The Board approved.

- 3. Because a favorable response to the organization of a Local Health Officers Council has been received from the local health officers, it is hoped that such an organization will be established upon the employment of a new District Health Officer.
- 4. A meeting was held by Doctors Darrough, Beare, and Lane to discuss potential problems and to establish laison in anticipation of the added responsibility assumed by Dr. Darrough when Dr. Beare leaves the department. Dr. Lane stated that he will be available for consultation at any time.

Dr. Beare stated that the past year has been a very pleasant one for him. The department has been a challenge, and the experience gained valuable. He feels that the Health District has an excellent and most cooperative staff. He thanked the Board for their support during the year to him and to the staff.

Sanitation Report: For July, as appended.

Mr. Stockton reported that the Fee Equalization Committee had met three times during the past month. All members feel the meetings are valuable and are of the opinion that this should become a permanent committee to meet and work out sanitation problems as they relate to the various agencies involved. They plan on meeting together every four to six weeks. He submitted the attached schedule of fees setting forth the present county and city fees and the committee's recommended changes of these fees. The committee had some discussion relative to the Health District taking over the septic tank program within the City of Everett. Mr. Stockton states that such could be possible but would of necessity have to be set up under one set of regulations and/or code and that the Health District would have to receive septic tank permit fees now paid to the City of Everett.

X-Ray Equipment

Mr. McCollum read a letter from Dr. Richard C. Kiltz, Radiologist in Everett, recommending a change in cameras to one of the Odelca type for finer films with less radiation produced, a change in the identification system, necessary motor replacement and addition of adaptor parts. Discussion followed, and Mr. Ingram recommended calling for bids for the equipment. The attached resolution was unanimously adopted.

Health Department Law

Moved by Mrs. Simpson, seconded by Mr. Johnson, and carried that Mr. Ingram write a letter to Dr. Wallace Iane and Dr. Bernard Bucove of the Washington State Health Department pointing out some of our experiences in the last two years concerning budgetary problems and asking for some clarification by the legislature on budgetary practises for health districts. Mr. Stockton requested that some of the Sanitation Department's problems be included in the letter.

Recess

The meeting was recessed until Monday, August 27 at 1:30 p.m., at which time bids for the X-ray equipment will be opened.

Members, Messrs. McCollum, Wyatt, Kraetz, Johnson, Gebert. Also, Dr. Darrough, Dr. Vanderwilt, Miss Findlay, Mr. Stockton, and Mrs. Supper.

New Business

Dr. Darrough informed the Board that Dr. Wallace Lane has received application for the position of District Health Officer from Dr. Reuben Yeller of Canada and that he would like to introduce Dr. Yeller to the Board on September 5. The Board will meet at 10:15 a.m. on September 5 to interview Dr. Yeller and to have lunch at the Elks Club, Everett.

The scheduled meeting with Dr. McLaughlin of Canada was cancelled because Dr. McLaughlin was unable to attend.

Dr. Darrough discussed with the Board the removal of old furniture no longer in use at the Health District building and the acquisition of a safe.

An addendum to the proposed 1963 budget was passed out to members. This adds the position of Assistant Health Officer.

X-Ray Equipment Bids Mr. McCollum opened and read five bids for X-ray equipment, as shown in detail on attached sheet. Moved by Mr. Gebert, seconded by Mr. Johnson, and carried that the bid be awarded at a Special Meeting on September 5, 1962 at 11:00 a.m.

Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 2:00 p.m.

RESOLUTION

The following resolution was unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the x-ray facilities of the Snohomish Health District have been antiquated,

WHEREAS, said x-ray facilities are in constant need of service, break down frequently, and produce poor quality in films, necessitating re-take procedures,

WHEREAS, re-taking of pictures has caused the public inconvenience as well as concern, and considerable additional cost to the Health District,

WHEREAS, the Board of Health has received reports from the Acting Health Officer, J. W. Darrough and the Assistant to the Acting Health Officer, John A. Beare, concerning the condition of this equipment, and the Board of Health has also been advised concerning the x-ray facilities by R. C. Kiltz, M.D., Radiologist of Everett;

WHEREAS, the Board of Health of the Snohomish Health District is of the opinion that a state of urgency does in fact exist, and the Board of Health has been further advised by the State Department of Health and by the Chairman of the Board of Snohomish County Commissioners that the sum of \$9000 will be considered for transfer within the Tuberculosis Control Fund of Snohomish County so that said sum can be transferred to the Snohomish Health District Pooling Fund to provide for the purchase of conversion equipment of said x-ray facilities;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Snohomish Health District call for bids for the conversion of existing x-ray equipment to provide for Odelca straight hood camera, safety monitor, and RS-100 cassette, film identification system, 60 line grid, related components and accessories necessary to provide complete functional unit, ten stainless steel processing hangers for use in standard developing tank, prepared by the Acting Health Officer in accordance with specifications as in his judgment will enable suppliers to submit bids for conversion and necessary repair;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in view of the emergency now confronting the Health District that said call for bids be posted in the manner for posting of notices by State law in the lobby of the County Jail, County Courthouse, and City Hall in Everett, and published once in the Everett Daily Herald, which posting and publication shall be at least five days before the 27th day of August, 1962, and which notice shall further provide that all bids shall be in writing, sealed and to be opened by the Board of Health on the 27th day of August, 1962 at 1:30 o'clock p.m. in the conference room at 3001 Rockefeller Avenue, Everett.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Health Officer be directed to contact all known suppliers of the x-ray equipment which the District desires to purchase and give them a copy of the call for bids which the Chairman of the Board of Health and the Acting Health Officer are authorized to prepare and sign in accordance with this resolution.



Dear Dr. Darrough:

In compliance with the request from you and Dr. Beare, I have examined the x-ray facilities in the Health District Building.

The present equipment can be upgraded and renovated to produce top quality films. In my opinion this requires principally a change in cameras from the present installation to one of the Odelca type for finer films with less radiation are produced. This should be augmented by a change in the identification system, as necessary motor replacement and addition of adaptor parts for the existing standard.

In summary, a conversion of the current camera to an improved model plus necessary accessories, used with existing standard, x-ray tube and generator will be of more practicability; than obtaining a complete new unit. From the standpoint of serviceability components of the same manufacturer can be of value.

I trust this information is helpful to you, but if I can be of added service please call upon me.
