### MINUTES SNOHOMISH DISTRICT BOARD OF HEALTH August 17, 1965

Present:

Members, Mrs. Simpson, Messrs. Krekow, Wyatt, Kraetz, McCollum, Alexander, and Stocker. Also, Dr. Anderson, Dr. Darrough, Dr. Millard, Miss Findlay, Mrs. Schultz, Mr. Moser, Mr. Stockton, Mrs. Manley, Mr. Ingram, Mr. Wilkinson, Mr. Swanson, and Mrs. Supper.

Minutes

Moved by Mrs. Simpson, seconded by Mr. Kraetz, and carried that the minutes of July 13, 1965 as previously circulated to members, be approved as written.

Auditing Committee Mr. Krekow appointed Mr. Kraetz and Dr. Stocker as the Auditing Committee.

County Meat Ordinance Dr. Millard stated that the County Meat Ordinance had been changed as per Mr. Shillberg's instructions. The two changes made are: Change wording "the Deputy Sanitarian who acts as Meat Inspector" in the first paragraph of the Resolution to read "Veterinary Meat inspector"; and omit words "slaughter houses" in Paragraph (i) of Section 1. DEFINITIONS. The City of Everett Meat Ordinance will be changed to read the same so that the City of Everett and the County Meat Ordinances will conform. The County's Ordinance will be advertised in the near future and a hearing held. Moved by Mrs. Simpson, seconded by Mr. Kraetz, and carried that the resolution by the Board of Health on May 11, 1965 adopting the County Meat Ordinance as written originally be amended to adopt the County Meat Ordinance with the above changes.

Immunization Fee

Dr. Anderson asked the Board of Health to approve a \$1.00 fee for all immunizations. The fee schedule now provides for \$1.00 charge for adults and 50¢ for children except that all oral polio is \$1.00 per dome. Moved by Mr. McCollum, seconded by Mr. Alexander, and carried that \$1.00 be charged for all immunizations.

Call for Bids

Dr. Anderson stated that he deemed it advisable for several reasons, which he enumerated, that the Health District administer Tri-valent oral polio vaccine instead of the Mono-valent vaccine which they have used for the past year. He asked for the Board's approval to call for bids for an estimated year's supply, as per Call for Bids as attached. Moved by Mr. Alexander, seconded by Mr. Kraetz, and carried that the attached Call for Bids be advertised in the county newspaper and copies be sent to the companies manufacturing Tri-valent polic vaccine.

Budgetary Passed

Dr. Anderson explained the circumstances necessitating the attached Resolution budgetary resolution. Moved by Mr. Alexander, seconded by Mr. Kraetz, and carried that the attached resolution be adopted.

Preliminary Dr. Anderson submitted a preliminary budget which has a deficit in revenues of approximately \$37,000. He made a plea for the Board of Submitted Health to retain the health department as a City-County District. He said he felt that recent legislation regarding Medicare, Head-Start, etc. would in the future make demands on health departments that only the larger ones with a qualified, capable staff could handle. The

public health picture is rapidly changing from rural to urban. Public health is becoming more specialized, and he foresees it becoming more and more involved in chronic diseases, air pollution, and other national health problems and programs.

Mr. Alexander stated that he hoped that the Board could find a solution to adequately financing the Health District. He said that the City of Everett must and will have a good health department, whether alone or in a district, but they would insist on equal funding if they continued in the district. He suggested that the Chairman appoint a City-County Committee to meet with Dr. Anderson and work out a solution. Mr. Krekow appointed Mr. McCollum and Mr. Alexander as a committee. Moved by Mr. Wyatt, seconded by Mrs. Simpson, and carried that the above committee meet with Dr. Anderson to work out a solution to the financing of the Health District.

#### Reports

Dr. Anderson reported that the Snohomish Health District would present an exhibit at the County Fair in September. The exhibit will call attention to some of the services of the Health District, emphasizing glaucoma, an eye disease. He also stated that on August 25 several doctors at Northern State Hospital would make a public report on the Snohomish County Intensive Treatment Research Project.

WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Health granted permission to the Snohomish County Childrens' Dental Program Inc. to purchase dental equipment and supplies for the amount of \$3,954, and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Health is unable to pay for such supplies directly, and they must be paid for by the local health department, and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Health has forwarded such monies to the Snohomish Health District for payment of said supplies, and

WHEREAS, the Snohomish Health District does not have sufficient funds in the Maintenance & Operation category of Supplies and Materials - Clinic and Laboratory or in Item 2 of Capital Outlay, it is necessary to increase the Maintenance & Operation category of Supplies and Materials - Clinic and Laboratory by \$667.53 and Capital Outlay - Item 2 by \$3,286.47, and extend the total amount of the 1965 Budget for the Snohomish Health District by the amount of \$3954.00.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Snohomish Health District deposit the amount of \$3,954 received from the Washington State Department of Health, Warrant No. H108636, with the Snohomish County Treasurer to the Snohomish Health District Pooling Fund under State & Federal Revenues as a refund, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Auditor increase the amount of Supplies and Materials - Clinic and Laboratory by \$667.53, Capital Outlay - Item 2 by \$3,286.47, and extend the Snohomish Health District 1965 Budget by \$3,954, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the attached voucher for the amount of \$3,954 be approved by the Board of Health for payment to the M.F. Patterson Dental Supply Company for dental supplies and equipment purchase d by the Snohomish County Childrens' Dental Program Inc.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SHOHDMISH COUNTY, WASHINGTON, RELATING TO MEAT, FISH, GAME, POULTRY, AND MEAT FOOD PRODUCTS; PROVIDING FOR THE INSPECTION AND REGULATION OF ESTABLISHMENTS ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF PREPARING, KEEPING, DISPOSAL AND SALE OF THE SAME; REQUIRING PERMITS THEREFOR, PROVIDING FOR THE REVOCATION OF PERMITS GRANTED; PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE PUBLIC MEALTH, SAFETY, AND WELFARE IN THE SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF MEAT, FISH, OR POULTRY.

whereas, The County Commissioners have received reports from the Sanitarian of the Snohomish Health District and the Veterinary Meat Inspector for said district.

the opinion that in the interest of protecting the public health, safety, and welfare in the sale and consumption of meet, fish, and poultry, local regulation is necessary and required.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners, as follows:

- Section 1. DEFINITIONS. Words and phrases as used herein shall have the following meanings:
  - (a) MEAT shall mean and include all animal flash, carcasses and parts thereof, uncooked, meat, sausage, cured meat, and poultry, prepared, processed, sold or offered for sale for human consumption or sold and disposed of as human food.
  - (b) FISH shell meen any water-breading enimal, including shell fish, which is prepared, processed, sold or effored for sale for human consumption.

- (c) SAUSAGE shall meen and include chopped or ground fresh meat, either in bulk or in casings and which has been prepared in a licensed meet shop holding a valid permit, etc., and into which enly approved and stemped meats have been placed.
- (d) GURED MEAT shall mean and include all meat which has been cured by smoking, salting, drying or other recognized trade processes of curing, but shall not include cured meet which is packed in cans or other rigid sealed container.
- (a) INSPECTED MEAT shall mean and include all meat which has been inspected, approved and stamped or tagged by an inspector of the Bureau of Animal industry of the Department of Agriculture of the United States, or of the Department of Agriculture of the State of Washington, or by a veterinary inspector approved in writing by the health officer.
- (f) RETAIL MEAT AND FISH SHOP shell
  meen and include all premises, buildings or parts thereof in which meat
  or fish is prepared, processed, sold
  or offered for sele for human consumption, but shall not include
  premises in which animals are
  slaughtered.
- (g) DELICATESSEN STORE shall meen and include all premises, buildings or parts thereof selling only cured meets and meets only in the original package, as received from the wholesele meet dealer.
- (h) WHOLESALE MEAT OR FISH DEALER shall meen and include all persons who sall at wholesale to ratell meet and fish shaps, hotels, restaurants or institutions in the County of Snahamish, whether said wholesaler is located in the County of Snahamish or without said County.
- (1) MEAT ESTABLISHMENTS shall meen and include retail meet and fish shaps, wholesale dealer establishments and any place where meet or fish, intended for sale to a consumer, may be handled, stered or processed, except those premises liceased as delicatessen atore.
