MINUTES
SNOHOMISH DISTRICT BOARD OF HEALTH
March 8, 1966

Present: Members, Mrs. Simpson, Messrs. Kraetz, McCollum, Wyatt, and Krekow. Also, Dr. Anderson, Dr. Darrough, Dr. Millard, Mrs. Schultz, Miss Findlay, Mrs. Carleton, Mr. Stockton, Mr. Moser, and Mrs. Supper.

Minutes Moved by Mrs. Simpson, seconded by Mr. McCollum, and carried that the minutes of February 8, 1966, as previously circulated to members, be approved as written.

Auditing Committee Mr. Kraetz appointed Mrs. Simpson and Mr. McCollum as the Auditing Committee.

Air Pollution The Board decided to discuss the proposed resolution for the control of burning in the County at the next meeting when more members are present.

Reports Dr. Anderson reported on the meeting of the American Medical Association at San Francisco which he attended. He also reported on the annual meeting of Dr. Bernard Bucove and local health officers of the State of Washington which was held in Olympia the first week in March.

Dr. Anderson announced the opening of the first Well Child Conference in Everett. It will be held in the Community Center at Baker Heights.

Dr. Anderson reported that monies had been appropriated through the State Department of Health for services of the Health District Nursing Division for four months for Supervision of the Visiting Nurses Association and for coordination of a referral system between the hospitals and the Visiting Nurses Association for people over 65 years of age. This is all in connection with the Medicare Program.

Dr. Anderson reported that the Asian type flu was probably among us. Blood specimens have been taken from several ill people in Everett and at Paine Field and sent to the laboratory at Seattle.

Vital Statistics: The totals for the year of 1965 were passed out. Dr. Anderson stated that Snohomish County was about normal as compared to the State of Washington as a whole. However, three persons who were patients at Providence Hospital were found to have Tuberculosis and one died of unsuspected Tuberculosis. This occurrence is found in the older age brackets. All contacts of such persons are followed by the Health District. Dr. Anderson emphasized that even with a rigid Tuberculosis Control Program, Tuberculosis has not been halted.


