MINUTES  
SNOHOMISH DISTRICT BOARD OF HEALTH  
February 14, 1967

**Present** Members, Mrs. Simpson, Messrs. Fosse, Fowler, Kraetz, Krekow, Alexander, McCollum, and Forsgren. Also, Dr. Anderson, Dr. Darrough, Dr. Millard, Miss Findlay, Mr. Stockton, Mr. Moser, Miss Hoeschen, Miss Schneider, Mrs. Manley, Mrs. DeSoto, Mr. Senter, and Mrs. Supper.

**Minutes** Moved by Mr. Alexander, seconded by Mr. Kraetz, and carried that the minutes of January 24, 1967, be approved as written.

**Auditing Committee for March** Mr. Fowler appointed Mr. Alexander and Mr. Forsgren as the Auditing Committee for the March meeting.

**Budget Committee** Mr. Fowler appointed Mrs. Simpson, Mr. Kraetz, and Mr. McGinness as Budget Committee for the year of 1967.

**Personnel Committee** Mr. Fowler appointed Mr. Kincaid, Mr. Krekow, Mr. Fosse, and Mr. Alexander as the Personnel Committee for the year of 1967.

**Refrigerators** There have been no bids received for the purchase of two used refrigerators which are no longer being used in the clinic. Disposal will be postponed until the March meeting.

**Staff Medical Insurance** Dr. Anderson stated that after Health District employees had been accepted for participation in the City of Everett's Health Insurance plan, they had subsequently been notified that the council had vetoed this. Discussion followed concerning the payment of premiums and the effect the addition of new members might have on the current rate. The Personnel Committee will pursue this further and also other demands of the Health District nursing staff.

**Opening and Award of Bids** At 2:00 o'clock, three bids for ten or more automobiles were opened and read: Bickford Motors, Inc. - \$2,072.12 per 1967 Ford Falcon; Follestad-Rambler, Inc. - \$1,937.39 per 1967 Rambler Rebel 550; Walsh-Platt Motors - \$1,822.55 per 1967 Dodge Dart. Moved by Mr. Alexander, seconded by Mr. Krekow, and carried that the bids be checked, and if in order, eleven (11) 1967 Dodge Darts be ordered from Walsh-Platt Motors at \$1,822.55 each. Moved by Mr. Alexander, seconded by Mr. Forsgren and carried that the 1957 and 1959 Plymouths not be traded in on the new automobiles, but that they be sold at auction when the County auctions their used equipment and vehicles in the Spring.

**Health District Laws** Mr. Don Senter, representing Mr. William Ingram, Attorney to the Board of Health, discussed Chapter 70.46 of the Revised Code of Washington which pertains to Health Districts and the history of this District since its creation. He further discussed two House Bills, Nos. 498 and 466, which if passed, would clarify the standards and minimum requirements of public health and provide enforceable laws.

In addition, Bill No. 466 would define Health Districts, cities' responsibility regarding providing health services and hiring health officers or financially participating in a health district. Mr. Senter felt that the Board of Health should send a letter to County legislators informing them of the importance of this bill and urging them to back it. The Executive Secretary was asked to see that this is done. Mr. Fowler said that he was going to Olympia and would talk to County representatives if it were the wish of the Board. Moved by Mr. Krekow, seconded by Mr. Alexander, and carried that Mr. Fowler discuss this bill with County legislators. Mr. Alexander pointed out that Bill 466 provides that health guidelines be worked out by the Association of Washington Cities and the Association of County Commissioners. He stated that he feels the guidelines should be set up by the Health Districts alone. Discussion followed. Mr. Fosse recommended that the councils of the cities who are members of the Health District be made aware of the importance of the Bill and their support asked. Mr. Stockton will do this.

Reports

Vital Statistics - for December, 1966, as appended. Dr. Anderson observed that while more boys than girls were born during 1966, more men than women died. Illegitimate births increased commensurate with the increase in population.

Community Health Administrator - Mr. Stockton stated that he had contacted several of the member cities and was meeting with their councils. He added that Brier has already chosen a Health Committee.

Financial - Revenues deposited in January, 1967 - \$28,864.88

Authorization of Accounts Moved by Mr. Krekow, seconded by Mr. Fosse, and carried that accounts as presented for payment be approved.

Adjournment The meeting was adjourned at 2:50 p.m.

## Health Bill Takes Back Seat, Attorney Declares

A legislative bill vital to better health service has taken a back seat in Olympia, Snohomish Health District board members were told Tuesday.

There are two health bills proposed in the state's lower house, Attorney Don Senter told the board.

The most vital of the two, House Bill 466, which could help communities to provide adequate health services, is being shoved into the background, Senter contended.

Meanwhile, he explained, House bill 498, which defines the duties and powers of state health officers, has gained more of the legislatures interest.

House Bill 466, which the board agreed needs backing, would demand that cities either hire a full-time health officer — a qualified physician — or pay for services by the health district.

State law already requires that a health district provide services to all residents within its district. But payment into the district is voluntary.

In Snohomish County the majority of cities started to pay for health district services this year — at 50 cents per capita.

The move was initiated for better countywide health service.

The county also, pays 50 cents per capita into the district, which along with county taxes and state funds provide operating expenses for the district.

Snohomish County was the first in the state to gain majority support from its cities.

But seven communities in the county, including Snohomish, Marysville and Mukilteo, do not pay for district services — but receive them. Most of the seven cities, however, have indicated interest in joining the district.

If the bill becomes law, there would be no question.

But, said Dick Forsgren, new member of the board represent-

ing Lynnwood, Brier and Mountlake Terrace, "there still aren't enough teeth in the bill."

He referred to the fact that no payment figures were mentioned in the bill, nor means of collection.

Other board members noted that the bill asks that guidelines be worked out with the Washington Association of Cities.

Snohomish County interest in the house bill, County Commissioner Dick Fowler, new chair-

man of the health district, suggested, should be brought to the attention of legislators.

"I'm going to Olympia Wednesday," he commented, "and I'll talk it over if you wish."

Board members agreed. Of the participating cities, only Edmonds lacked representation at the Tuesday board meeting. As a primary city, Edmonds has three representatives on the 11-member board. The board meets on the second Tuesday of each month.

Snohomish County cities participating in the health district are Everett, Edmonds, Brier, Lynnwood, Mountlake Terrace, Darrington, Gold Bar, Granite Falls, Index, Stanwood and Sultan.

State law now states that cities which belong to a health district cannot withdraw until after membership of two years. To withdraw a city must give six months notice and funds for the balance of that year remain with the district.



## CHAPTER 70.46

### HEALTH DISTRICTS

**70.46.010** Definitions. For the purpose of this chapter words and phrases shall have the meaning herein ascribed to them:

“Health district” means all the territory embraced within a single county and all cities and towns therein, except primary cities, and/or all the territory consisting of one or more counties and all the cities and towns in all of the combined counties, except primary cities, which have been combined and organized as hereinafter provided. No city having a population of one hundred thousand or more shall be included in any health district.

“Primary city” as used herein shall mean a city having a population of twenty thousand or more and less than one hundred thousand.

**Validating:** “Any expenditures heretofore made by any county, city or town, not made fraudulently and which were within the legal limits of indebtedness, towards the expense of maintenance and operation of a health district consisting of any combination of a county or counties, cities and towns, are hereby legalized and ratified.” [1945 c 183 § 10.]

**70.46.020** Districts of two or more counties—Health board. Health districts consisting of two or more counties may be created whenever two or more boards of county commissioners shall by resolution declare their intention to combine for such purpose. Such a district shall consist of all the area of the combined counties including all cities and towns except primary cities. The health board of such a district shall consist of two members of the board of county commissioners of each county member, appointed by the respective boards of county commissioners of each county included in the district, together with members selected by cities and towns included in said district, as hereinafter provided.

**70.46.030** Districts of one county—Board of health. A health district to consist of one county only and including all cities and towns therein except primary cities may be created whenever the board of county commissioners of the county shall pass a resolution declaring its intention to organize such a health district under this chapter. The district board of health of such district shall consist of the three members of the board of county commissioners of the county, together with members selected by the cities and towns included in said district, as hereinafter provided.

**70.46.040 Inclusion of a primary city.** Whenever a primary city desires to be included in a health district and shall through its legislative authority petition the district board of health to be included and the district board of health and the city legislative authority agree as to the functions to be performed for the city by the health district and the amount of financial contributions to be made by the city to the health district such cities shall be included in the health district. Whenever any such city is included within a health district, its board of health and its health officer shall continue to exercise such powers and duties as are otherwise by law vested and imposed upon them and which are not to be performed and exercised by the district board of health and district health officer under the agreement in which the city is included in the health district.

**70.46.050 Representation on the health board.** Whenever a primary city is included in a health district it shall have equal representation with the board of county commissioners of the county in which said primary city is located, the city's representatives to be selected by the legislative body of the city from among its membership. If only one second, third, or fourth class city makes a financial contribution to the district health fund satisfactory to the board and is included in the district, each of such cities is entitled to one member on the board; but when more than one city of any of such classes makes such contribution and is included in the district, all cities of the same class shall by joint action of their legislative bodies appoint one member of the district board from among their legislative bodies who shall be the representative of all cities of the same class. If the health board is composed only of members selected by a primary city, together with the county commissioners, said board shall select another person to serve thereon whose term shall be from January 1st to December 31st of each year, said other person to be a resident of the health district. All appointments shall be made within thirty days after the formation of the district. Vacancies on the district board of health shall be filled by appointment within thirty days and made in the same manner as was the original appointment. Representatives on the district board of the various units of the district shall continue at the pleasure of the legislative body of the unit.

**70.46.060 District health board—Powers and duties.** The district board of health shall constitute the board of health for all the territory included in the health district, and shall supersede and exercise all the powers and perform all the duties by law vested in the county or city or town board of health of any county, city or town included in the health district, except as herein otherwise provided.

**70.46.070 District health officer — Duties — Salary — Removal.** The district board of health shall elect a chairman, and appoint a district health officer who shall be a qualified physician trained and experienced in public health administration, and who shall act as executive secretary to, and administrative officer for the district board of health. He shall also be empowered to employ such technical and other personnel as approved by the district board of health. The district health officer shall be paid such salary and allowed such expenses as shall be determined by the district board of health. The district health officer shall hold office at the pleasure of the board, and shall not be removed until after notice is given him, and an opportunity for a hearing before the board as to the reason for his removal.

**70.46.080** **Treasurer — District funds — Contributions by counties and cities.** Each health district shall establish a fund to be designated as the "district health fund", in which shall be placed all sums received by the district from any source, and out of which shall be expended all sums disbursed by the district. The county treasurer of the county in the district embracing only one county; or, in a district composed of more than one county the county treasurer of the county having the largest population shall be the custodian of the fund, and the county auditor of said county shall keep the record of the receipts and disbursements, and shall draw and the county treasurer shall honor and pay all warrants, which shall be approved before issuance and payment as directed by the board.

Each county, city or town which is included in the district shall contribute such sums towards the expense for maintaining and operating the district as shall be agreed upon between them. Payments into the fund of the district may be made by the county or city or town members during the first year of membership in said district from any funds of the respective county, city or town as would otherwise be available for expenditures for health facilities and services, and thereafter the members shall include items in their respective budgets for payments to finance the health district.

**70.46.090** **Withdrawal of county or city.** Any county or any city or town may withdraw from membership in said health district any time after it has been within the district for a period of two years, but no withdrawal shall be effective except at the end of the calendar year in which the county, city or town gives at least six months' notice of its intention to withdraw at the end of the calendar year. No withdrawal shall entitle any member to a refund of any moneys paid to the district nor relieve it of any obligations to pay to the district all sums for which it obligated itself for the year at the end of which the withdrawal is to be effective.

**70.46.100** **Power to acquire, maintain, or dispose of property—Contracts.** In addition to all other powers and duties, a health district shall have the power to own, construct, purchase, lease, add to, and maintain any real and personal property or property rights necessary for the conduct of the affairs of the district. A health district may sell, lease, convey or otherwise dispose of any district real or personal property no longer necessary for the conduct of the affairs of the district. A health district may enter into contracts to carry out the provisions of this section.

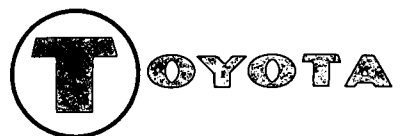
