MINUTES

SNOHOMISH DISTRICT BOARD OF HEALTH March 11, 1969

Present

Members, Messrs, Marler, Fiege, Michelson, Langus, Kincaid, Fosse, Hutchins, Forsgren and Fowler. Also Dave Stockton, Helen Scales Leo Moser, Dr. Luke, Dorothy Findlay, Charles Mangum, William Ingram, Robert White, Judy Blake, Vern Johnson and Alma Sherlock.

Minutes

Minutes of February 11th meeting was approved as mailed.

Auditing Committee Mr. Kincaid appointed Mr. Slye and Mr. Forsgren as the Auditing Committee for April.

Housing for Health District

Vern Johnson reported on field trips taken to look at health centers in other areas. He stated that monies for health centers might be available under Hill-Burton funds but that applications for these funds for 1970 must be submitted by June 30th. Discussion was then held and it was decided that the entire matter of housing the health district should be explored.

Moved by Mr. Fiege, seconded by Mr. Michelson and carried that a two man committee be formed to work with Dr. Anderson, Dave Stockton and Vern Johnson.

Subsequent to the meeting Chairman Kincaid appointed Mr. Fowler and Mr. Michelson on the housing committee to represent the Board of Health.

Cash Registers

One bid was received which was read from Alpine Office Supplies.

Moved by Mr. Michelson, seconded by Mr. Fiege and carried that the Health District purchase three machines as outlined in the bid.

Environmental Health Resolution Mr. Moser presented a report to the Board regarding problems existing in enforcement of sewage nuisances. Mr. Moser then presented a resolution prepared by Mr. Ingram and himself regarding the enforcement procedure for critical sewage nuisances and a proposed contractual arrangement to be made by the applicant for holding tanks and the Snohomish Health District.

Mr. Forsgren wished to go on record to say if new schools are built and is in need of holding tanks they should be permissable.

Mr. Fowler said we are going to have to tighten up our regulations and face up to the fact that we are going to have to say "no" where sewage problems might exist.

Moved by Mr. Fiege, seconded by Mr. Hutchins and carried that the resolution be given back to Mr. Ingram so that it can be amended to read that new holding tanks are not allowed but current holding tanks to be controlled.

Personnel Committee Chairman, Mr. Kincaid appointed Mr. Fiege as Chairman of the Personnel Committee for 1969.

Employee Resolution Moved by Mr. Fiege, seconded by Mr. Langus and carried that the Board accept the resolution to have \$650.00 transferred from PHN II to PHN I.

Program Planning

Mr. Fiege discussed program planning and the need to consider budgetary requirements for 1970. Mr. Stockton stated that program plans were now being made for next year and that these will be available at the next meeting. Mr. Fiege stated that the Board could begin to consider per capita assessments once the program plans are made available for discussion.

The question was raised over whether building in the county would be retarded by the action, but some board members felt this was beside the point when a question of health was in-

In other business, the board continued discussion on the possibility of a centrally located building for the health district. A committe was approved to investigate the need for such a facility; members will be appointed later in the week.

Board chairman Al Kincaid pointed out that "we have no financing capacity of our own" for obtaining or constructing a building. A possibility exists for obtaining up to 40 per cent of the cost of land and a building for a health center through a federal grant under the Hill-Burton Act. The health district would have to guarantee the remaining 60 per cent, and as of yesterday officials had no plans for obtaining these funds.

The possibility of using Paine Field facilities was raised, but Budget Director Vern Johnson said this did not look very prom-ising: "The Air Force took ev-erything out."

The board approved a bid of \$3,900.43 by Alpine Office Equipment of Everett to provide three cash registers.

Board member Gene Fiege, a city councilman from Mountlake Terrace, was re-appointed chairman of the Personnel Com-

Passed in Regular Session of the Snohomish District Board of Health this 11th day of March, 1969

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Director of Environmental Health Division of the Snohomish Health District has made report to the Snohomish Health District Board of Health concerning private sewage disposal facilities,

WHEREAS, it appears that in certain instances prompt civil action should be instituted in order to abate a public nuisance created by the breakdown of such private sewage disposal facilities which results in the accumulation of material carrying communicable disease bacteria injurious to human life,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Snohomish Health District of the Board of Health as follows:

1. That the form of Health Officer's Order attached hereto is hereby approved for use in the discretion of the Health Officer in those situations resulting from defective private sewer disposal facilities which result in a critical condition potentially hazardous to the public health and which require immediate redress. That the District Health Officer be and he is hereby authorized in the event situations arise within the County of Snohomish which in his discretion are critical as a result of the breakdown of private sewer disposal facilities to immediately request the assistance of the municipal attorneys for the particular municipal governmental agency in which such public nuisance may be created to commence with the advice and counsel of the Health District attorney a civil action seeking injunctive relief to immediately abate such public health hazard.

That such actions be undertaken by and with the consent of the chief legal officer of the particular governmental agency having immediate jurisdiction over the property involved and with the consultation and assistance of the Health District attorney who is authorized to associate with such a legal staff for purposes of a civil action seeking equitable relief.

- 2. That the cost of such litigation insofar as reasonably possible be borne by the respective governmental authority involved and the Health Officer be authorized to incur expenses, if necessary, by way of filing fees, witness fees, and other expenses attendant upon the proper presentation of this type of case as may be approved by the Health District attorney and the Health Officer and that such expenditures be taken from that portion of the Health District budget reserved for such purposes under the classification
- 3. That in those situations where the Environmental Health Division is requested to issue a permit for the installation of holding tanks for a private sewer disposal facility, that the applicant be required to enter into a contractual undertaking with the Snohomish Health District by the terms of which contract the applicant will agree to maintain said private sewer disposal facility in proper working order and to keep the same pumped. That said contract further contain an undertaking that such applicant as owner will be liable to any third party injured or damaged by a breakdown or failure of such holding tank to properly operate or by his failure to exercise ordinary care in the use of such private sewer disposal facility. That the Health District attorney be requested to prepare such contractual undertaking and that said document when approved by the

Health Officer, shall be required as a condition precedent to the issuance of a permit for the installation of a holding tank as a private sewer. It disposal facility. That the Division of Environmental Health of the Snohomish Health District further be requested and directed to request the cooperation of all users of such holding tanks under existing permits. That the regulations of the Health District with reference to the granting of such permits be amended accordingly and the Snohomish Health District attorney directed to prepare such amendatory regulations as may be required to carry out this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, YOU ARE HEREBY ORDERED to immediately correct the defects in the facility above described within hours from the date of this order. In the event you fail to correct said condition within the time specified, then you are directed to immediately cease the use of said sewer system serving the above described premises and to cause the occupancy thereof to be vacated until said system has been

corrected. Failure to comply with this order shall subject you to immediate legal action under the provisions of Section 14 of the Sewage Waste Disposal Resolution passed by the Board of Health of the Snohomish Health District, and the laws of the State of Washington.

SUBJECT: Report regarding problems existing in enforcement of sewage nuisances.

- 1. The Environmental Health Division is receiving sewage waste nuisance complaints at the rate of 30-40 per month within Snohomish County. Further action is often necessary through legal means in seeking compliance to these public health nuisances.
- 2. Effective enforcement of sewage disposal regulations depends upon cooperation and communication by our department personnel and member governmental agencies of both cities and county legal staffs.
- 3. At the present time 14 sewage nuisance complaints have been referred to the Prosecuting Attorney office and 6 to the City of Everett for action. 1 to the City of Edmonds.
- 4. Occasionally, a public health nuisance occurs which in our opinion, constitutes an immediate public health hazard. Corrective measures must be immediate.
- 5. The Health District maintains a private attorney to the Board of Health who is retained primarily on a consulting or advisory basis and does not pursue prosecution of violations of regulations.

Therefore, based upon the above observations, I recommend that the Board of Health formulate a policy to cope with the increasing problem of private sewage disposal failures. To implement this, I recommend as follows:

- 1. Approval of the proposed resolution dealing with critical situation in the area of private sewage disposal failures by redress to the Superior Court upon failure to comply with an emergency Health Officer's Order.
- Approval of the resolution regarding holding tank and the adoption of a contract or contractural undertaking for the use of such private sewage facilities.
- 3. That the legal staffs of both cities and county be requested to review the new policy of the Board of Health with the Health District's Attorney for specific recommendations and assistance in the enforcement of this program.
- 4. There still exists a possibility of a conflict between the sewage waste resolution passed by the Board of Health in September of 1968 and the county resolution of 1963 which is in effect. This difference should be resolved for the sake of unity in requirements.
