SNOHOMISH DISTRICT BOARD OF HEALTH  
September 9, 1969

- Absent Member, Langus
- Minutes The minutes of August 12, 1969 were approved as mailed.
- Budget Planning Mr. Stockton reported he had met with some of the city councils regarding per capita assessment for public health services. Four cities, by resolution, have agreed to the \$1.00 per capita assessment and three cities are taking this under consideration. Discussion was held regarding the motion that was made at the August 12th meeting.
- Moved by Mr. Hutchins, seconded by Mr. Forsgren that the Board postpone action on the budget to the next regular meeting at which time perhaps they could have answers from the county and cities.
- Amendment to motion: Moved by Mr. Fiege, seconded by Mr. Fosse that the Board establish a date as soon as possible prior to October 6th for a special meeting of the board members. The date was set for September 30th at 1:45 p.m.
- Amendment to amendment: Moved by Mr. Fiege, seconded by Mr. Slye that the Board make a decision on September 30th regarding per capita assessment. Motion carried. Voting was done by a roll call vote.  
YES: Members, Hill, Kraetz, Forsgren, Michelson, Slye, Hutchins, Fiege, Fosse and Mrs. Biderbost.
- Roll call vote was then taken on the motion. YES: Hill, Kraetz, Forsgren and Hutchins. NO: Michelson, Slye, Fiege, Fosse and Mrs. Biderbost. Motion failed.
- Special Meeting Mr. Michelson requested that the chairman call a special meeting of the board members only for Wednesday, September 17, 1969 at 1:30 p.m. in the County Commissioners office to look over the proposed budget.
- Cities Assessment Moved by Mr. Fiege, seconded by Mrs. Biderbost that the Snohomish District Health Board inform its participating members that the per capita assessment for 1970 has been established at \$1.00.
- Roll call vote was taken. YES: Michelson, Slye, Fiege, Fosse, and Mrs. Biderbost. NO: Hill, Forsgren, Kincaid and Hutchins. Motion carried.
- Resolution Moved by Mr. Slye, seconded by Mr. Fiege and carried that there be a revision of the budget of \$168.00 for the nursing clerk beginning Sept. 1, 1969.

# Health District Fee Stirs Fight

The figure of \$1 was the central issue in a debate that lasted for more than two hours yesterday at a meeting of the Snohomish County Health Board.

The decision: To set \$1 as the per capita assessment rate for health district services. This amount would be paid by the health district's participating agencies, which include the county government and all the cities in the county.

The present assessment rate is 50 cents for each city or county resident.

Motions were made, passed and then revoked in confusing succession until the board members arrived at the decision, which was essentially the same

as the one they made a month ago.

Although all the board members agreed that \$1 is the necessary rate to meet health district costs, several voted against the resolution on grounds that some of the participating cities or the county might be unable to afford the new rate, and they should be consulted first.

Among those voting against the resolution was board chairman A. L. Kincaid of Edmonds, who insisted that the participating governments should have a voice in making the decision. Even with the new rate established, the member agencies should be told that it may be lowered if it appears they will be unable to pay \$1 for each of their residents.


Health district representatives have presented the new rate for consideration before the councils of several cities in the county during the past few weeks. Several cities have agreed to pay the \$1 rate, some are still considering, and others have not yet been contacted, said David Stockton, health district administrator.

The participating agencies have the option of dropping their health district membership and not receiving its services if they do not want to pay the assessment. If they do this, however, state law requires that they hire their own health officer and offer certain health services, said William Ingram, health district attorney.

The new rate, which would go into effect in 1970, is necessary to pay for salary increases, several new staff members and other health district costs, said David Stockton. These and other items tentatively planned for the coming year would have to be reduced or dropped if the \$1 figure is not adopted in the final budget, he said.
